The following provides a glimpse into the work already in progress for 2022 and going forward.

## **CONFERENCES ON WORK & CANCER**

Held virtually for the third time, the Midwest and National Conferences on Work & Cancer continue to address the myriad of issues faced by survivors in the workplace and during a job search. These free, day-long educational events bring together experts in the fields of career/employment, mental health, and law to cover relevant content and resources.

### MIDWEST CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- 224 attendees from 26 states; 79% from Midwest Region
- 10 community partners
- 100% of attendees would recommend this conference to others
- 45 laptops distributed in 14 states: 66% of recipients are in active treatment

### NATIONAL CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- 663 attendees from 48 states/territories and 5 countries outside of the U.S.
- 40 community partners
- 100% of attendees would recommend this conference to others
- 55 laptops distributed in 25 states; 73% of recipients are in active treatment

### **BALANCING WORK & CANCER WEBINARS**

Our monthly webinar series has reached 1,052 survivors, caregivers, and healthcare professionals, providing them with vital education on job search, working through treatment, disclosure, stress management, and more.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

\$75,000 in emergency cash assistance was distributed for the third year in a row to patients and survivors, providing funds to use for bills, technology, copayments, skills development, or training.

### **LOOKING AHEAD**

Beyond delivering our annual programs and services, including the National & Midwest Conferences, resume reviews, Balancing Work & Cancer Webinars, and financial assistance grants, Cancer and Careers looks forward to continuing to meet our community's needs in Q4.

- Conduct annual Harris Poll that will examine the ongoing effects of COVID-19 on the cancer community and work, and further explore the experiences of Black and Hispanic survivors.
- Grow Spanish Ask the Experts into a series of four live, virtual events, giving our Spanish-speaking audience the opportunity to ask their most pressing work and cancer questions.
- Expand our publication library with two additions to the Cancer and Careers Survival Guide series, Communicating Effectively and Technical Tips for Virtual Interviews. Both will be available in English and Spanish, to order or download free-of-charge.
- The 8<sup>th</sup> annual West Coast Conference on Work & Cancer will focus on topics such as communicating effectively, developing a return-to-work plan and include a special 2.5-hour focus on job search and career shifting, the program will also provide 45 laptops to attendees without a reliable device.
