2023 OVERVIEW

Cancer and Careers provides support and real-time solutions for the cancer community's employment needs.

- 470,000+ individuals visited cancerandcareers.org & cancerandcareers.org/español
- Distributed more than 58,000 publications in English and Spanish
- Granted \$25,250 in emergency cash assistance to survivors facing financial crises.
- Produced 27 virtual events, including National & Regional Conferences and Work & Cancer Webinars.
- Gifted 105 laptops to patients and survivors being held back by unreliable technology.
- Presented at 24 programs for partner organizations across the U.S.
- Expanded our Spanish-speaking programs with two in-person events in Puerto Rico.
- Relaunched the In-Service Trainings for Healthcare Professionals with two virtual programs reaching 125 oncology professionals and advocates
- Published a new printed guide on cancer and online privacy in English and Spanish
- Supported 101 individuals by providing personalized one-on-one assistance.
- Fielded a new survey to understand the experiences people face balancing work and cancer.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS

For a fourth year, Cancer and Careers offered our Financial Assistance Grants program, bringing \$25,250 in emergency support to cancer patients and survivors during their most critical time of need.

129 survivors applied for the 2023 grant program, with 101 people receiving the support they needed to alleviate some of their everyday stress.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Now thirteen years strong, the National Conference on Work and Cancer continues to tackle fundamental issues of health, employment and everyday life.





2023 STATS

- 747 attendees from 46 states/territories and 11 countries
- 1,550 registrants
- Patients, survivors, caregivers and healthcare providers
- Full day of virtual programming, 100% free of charge

TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (TAP)

The Technology Assistance Program is designed to make attending the virtual Conference easier for those in our community who lack a reliable device—which affects access to much of CAC's current services as well as things like tele-health, support groups and remote work opportunities.

This program grants a one-time award of a laptop to eligible patients and survivors. We were able to expand this program for our 2023 National Conference and provide laptops to 40 survivors from 20 states; 70% of whom are still in active treatment.

REGIONAL CONFERENCES; EXPANDING THE NET

The rapid growth of our Midwest and West Coast Regional Conferences is a testament to the nationwide need for our services. This momentum continued with our virtual formats in 2023.



10th Annual Midwest Conference:

- March 24, 2023
- 478 total registrants
- 295 attendees including:
 - 40 Technology Assistance Program recipients

9th Annual West Conference:

- October 21, 2023
- 314 total registrants
- 120 attendees including:
 - 25 Technology Assistance Program recipients



TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (TAP)

For the fourth year in a row, we continued the Technology Assistance Program for our 2023 Regional Conferences and provided laptops to 65 survivors from 18 states, 61.5% of whom are still in active treatment.

REGIONAL CONFERENCES; ATTENDEE FEEDBACK

- 98.9% of surveyed attendees would recommend this conference to others





BALANCING WORK & CANCER WEBINARS

Since 2009, CAC has been providing high quality and targeted virtual programs to cancer patients, survivors, healthcare/HR professionals, employers and caregivers

In 2023, CAC produced twelve accredited webinars that reached 1,270 unique registrants and 629 unique participants. Many of the people who attended joined us for more than one session, making the overall attendance number 1,367.

Feedback for this program included 91% of surveyed attendees saying the webinar they attended was presented in a way they could apply to their day-to-day lives and 98% saying they would recommend the webinars to those interested in knowing more about work and cancer.

CONNECTING COMMUNITIES





Spanish-speaking patients and survivors can find comprehensive information about work after a diagnosis on the Cancer and Careers en Español website. Similar to CAC's English website, it offers articles, a resource directory, downloadable tools and videos.

In 2023, we continued our virtual programs for our Spanish-speaking community as well as new content to the Spanish website, including:

- A 4-part Ask the Experts live webinar series
- Financial assistance grant application
- Blogs & articles
- Spanish subtitles were added to six 2023 virtual hour-long programs
- Three Ask the Experts recordings were posted on the CAC Spanish website



CONNECTING COMMUNITIES



Cancer and Careers' Employment Seminars are interactive, in-person workshops held in small-scale, intimate settings that allow patients and survivors facing work-related challenges to connect with expert presenters and peers also diagnosed with cancer.

In 2023, we traveled to Puerto Rico to host our first-ever in-person Spanish-speaking events.



With all of the changes to the work-world in the past few years, it is important to produce publications—in both English and Spanish—specifically addressing how to navigate and succeed in this new/evolving landscape.

IN-TAKE SERVICES

Cancer and Careers is committed to providing individual support. Our program staff, including three in-house social workers—one of whom is bilingual—handle our audience's direct requests for personalized assistance through phone calls and emails.

In 2023, CAC staff engaged one-on-one with 101 patients, survivors and healthcare professionals, providing guidance and referrals.

Since 2013, this individualized service has supported 930 people with their unique needs.



THE HARRIS POLL

We commissioned our annual Harris Poll survey to uncover and document the current needs of survivors, including the unique experiences faced by Black and Hispanic patients/survivors, in the workplace. Results also highlighted differences in experience of people based on their age.
